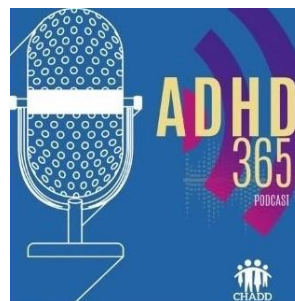
Panelist:
